## 3. Commentary

## **Health and Safety**

Oshawa Power continues to be diligent with our Health & Safety Program and are proud to report that we have continued to operate without a lost time injury bringing the total number of hours without a lost time injury to over 1.4 million hours. In a company of our size, this means that there have been no lost time injuries since July of 2016. Training and awareness continue to be a focus for the team, with the reporting of near misses and ideas for improvement welcomed.

## 4. Regulatory

The Regulatory and Commercial Affairs Department is responsible for preparing the company's annual reporting to the Ontario Energy Board (OEB). The department continues to focus on the preparation and writing of the Cost of Service rate Application for submission in April 2025 to secure rates for the 5-year period beginning in 2026. Each department within the organization is involved, with the Regulatory and Commercial Affairs Department leading the process and compiling all of the material for submission.

Quarterly reporting and record keeping requirements to the Ontario Energy Board (OEB) include the following:

- Commodity deferral and variance account balances
- Customer counts for each rate class
- Micro FIT and FIT generation connections

## Compliance

The Company is compliant with all bank covenants.

## **OEB Updates**

The OEB winter moratorium on disconnections came into effect on November 15, 2024 and remains in effect through April 30, 2025. During this time, residential customers who fall into arrears with their bills cannot have their service disconnected for non-payment. Oshawa Power has focused their efforts on working with these customers but has continued to see significant increases in its aged accounts, resulting in higher bad debt expense. Throughout the winter months, staff will continue to work with customers who have past due balances to make payment arrangements to ensure they are not falling further behind.

The new winter Time of Use rates have been announced by the Ontario Energy Board, with a decrease in rates for consumers effective November 1, 2024. Residential rates are as follows:

# 5. Support Programs

As noted above Oshawa Power only disconnects as a last resort and works with customers to avoid the hardship of disconnection whenever possible. The team assists customers not only by making flexible payment arrangements, but also by guiding them to programs that are available to assist with financial help.

## Low Income Energy Assistance Program (LEAP) Update

Funding parameters for the Low Income Energy Assistance Program (LEAP) have changed effective March 1, 2024, resulting in expanded threshold and effectively expanding the low income eligibility. With these changes, LEAP Funds were not finalized until April, 2024, with a total amount of \$74,792.84 in funding available to assist eligible customers. Some of the changes include the eligible income threshold, and an increase in the amount of grant that can be received from \$500.00 to \$650.00 and for those with electric heat an increase from \$600.00 to \$780.00. Due to the expanded eligibility thresholds under LEAP, the Compassion Fund has been halted.
