Good day,

Regarding the aforementioned notice of SF-25-18, Hearing/Council Meeting.

I will not be able to attend in person. My grievances in prior documentation, provided to Councillor Rick Kerr, are well described.

I would just like to **add**, that after a perpetual continuance of approximately 14 months of construction noise and vibration originating from mostly pneumatic drilling work done at 33 Richmond (2023-2024), I now have permanent ringing (tinnitus) in my right ear.

I will reiterate again, this was not solely regarding the "time of day" of the construction, but also the length of time which exceeded exposure rules for decibel damage(demonstrated by provided decibel meter readings throughout multiple units at 44 Bond W, including mine, as well as the common areas spaces).

No studies were done about the Environmental Noise Pollution, that under Government of Ontario guidelines, would bring a failing grade to the City of Oshawa.

Part of this By-law review and amendment request ,was to add the "volume" and also vibration penetration monitoring, to surrounding properties, and consider them for physical damage, as well as the aggravating factors to those that dwell within them.

Not even a singular notice was given, either by the city, or the property management of 33 Richmond, to the surrounding properties, to allow tax paying, property owners and tenants, the opportunity to make arrangements to move their at home businesses, or even get away from the disturbance in general.
