I am very disappointed with Oshawa Council for their unreasonable treatment of our non profit ,pay for tour Canadian Auto Museum,that use to get a grant of \$25,000 annually then it was reduced to \$5,000., and they are now being taxed at near \$20,000 in the midst of two years plus of Covid visitor cut backs while City Museums get over a million plus in support and would never survive in this economic climate of high inflation and Covid reduced paying visitations and ignored again this year .

Secondly the fire safety of leaving Firehall #1 with one fire suppression crewed vehicle to protect the downtown core of high rise new apartments and condos ,the armories, the hospital , the Genosh Hotel ,the Oshawa Clinic , the new arena , and blocks of small business and many older dwellings ,. This Hall should have received a new pumper and crew rather than spending \$650,000 on a Hazmat truck usually used to contain Chemical spills ,now being used a a medical vehicle apparently . Especially when our response time in the Dillon Fire strategy Report was a poor 50% and their experts said we should be striving for 90% which you chose to ignore in the \$200,000 Council paid Dillon Report . The problem is Firehall #1 still needs another suppression vehicle for downtown fires of the future and Council bought a useless vehicle in this regard. Council and the various committees should take a good look at fixing these mistakes as over 400 citizens of Oshawa are requesting Council rectify these concerns prior to the next municipal election ,kindly seek disposition of these matters!
